

“RETURN TO EXCELLENCE” IN ALASKA VOTING AND ELECTIONS

Adapted from excerpts of the Republican National Committee resolution of August 28, 2023, and from The Digital Autopsy And Hand Count Compliance by J. H. Pulitzer, February 26, 2024.

WHEREAS, ensuring the integrity of American voting and election administration is foundational, and is critical to maintaining a civil and decent society, as the founders of the United States intended;

WHEREAS, the Republican National Committee (RNC) unanimously opposed complicated election schemes like ranked choice voting, in their August 29, 2023 resolution;

WHEREAS, the 2021 Maricopa County presidential ballot audit, was a forensic examination of ballots cast in Maricopa County during the 2020 United States presidential election, set precedent in detailing the defects in our voting system, election procedures, mail-in ballots, bloated voter rolls, and intentionally complicated instituted systems which impede, belabor, and slow a once efficient election process.

WHEREAS, municipality governments passed legislation to allow undocumented, illegal immigrant non US citizens’ to vote in elections; including San Francisco, Oakland, Washington D.C., and Maryland.

WHEREAS, counties in the following states have banned electronic voting machines and tabulators; Arizona, California, Colorado, Georgia, Missouri, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas;

WHEREAS, boroughs and counties in the following states, have banned the controversial ranked-choice voting (RCV): Florida, Idaho, Montana, South Dakota, Tennessee and Fairbanks*Alaska;

WHEREAS, the former State of Alaska Lt. Governor Kevin Meyer acting as Secretary of State, declared *Alaskan’s personal information was breached electronically through the State Of Alaska voter database, by foreign entities*;

WHEREAS, The State Of North Dakota abolished their voter registry, prior to 2020, and operated one of the least corrupt elections in 2020.

WHEREAS, despite a majority vote by the residents of the Matanuska Susitna Borough (MSB) to vote with a paper ballot and hand count, the State Of Alaska government continues to force or mandate those MSB voters to use those machines and tabulators in *state elections*. Hand counting was proven by the MSB voters to be a less expensive proposition then voting with machines.

WHEREAS, Department of Administration, former Commissioner Kelly Tshibaka, published an analysis in her report on the State of Alaska Department Of Elections (DOE), but the Alaska government redacted all but four pages of that report, and refuses to release it in it’s original form. Lt. Dahlstrom states that the Alaska Department Of Law, Attorney General has the original report.

WHEREAS, under this current Alaska election administration, the public is not allowed to examine at the voting machines, and/or tabulator software, data-bank, voting machine servers, and ballot printer;

LET IT BE RESOLVED, Alaska will abolish the bloated voter rolls and registration data-bank at the DOE, following in the foot steps of North Dakota's successful precedent in doing so;

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, No voting machines or ranked choice voting will be used in the 2024 Alaska elections;

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the State Of Alaska will abolish and cancel subscription to the ERIC voter system software that monitors our elections, and will use state funds to monitor the rolls to pay for hand counting election ballots.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, All elections will be conducted through Alaska's lawful voting method of hand-marked, hand counted paper ballots that are, (1) designed and made by a private company in Alaska, and that contract by bid, (2) created with a distinctive water mark, and (3) serialized numerically. Candidate winners will be announced within 48 hours of the election opening.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that Hand counted ballots will be fully observable by the public though video cameras that record and live-stream the ballot counting and the ballot box container at each polling place.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, the election ballots, tally, and paper-trial will be memorialized and maintained in paper copy form, under lock and key, for 10 years after certification;

LET IT BE KNOWN, Mail-in and absentee ballots will be issued to voters who have a valid and verified picture ID only. The voter will be vetted for legitimacy, and their ballots will be counted before or on election day.

THEREFORE, the 2024 Alaska election will return to the functional and historic balloting and polling experience that we Alaskan Americans understand, appreciate and love.
